



COVID Policy & Procedures Fall 2022

COVID Positive Student

If a student tests POSITIVE for COVID19, the student will isolate at home for 5 days. Day 0 is the first day of symptoms or the day of a positive test.

Students may return to school after day 5 of isolation without any further testing required as long as they are asymptomatic or they have been fever free for 24 hrs without the use of medication and other symptoms are improving.

Please notify the Director within 24 hours if your child is diagnosed with COVID-19.

Quarantine

The CDC no longer recommends any form of quarantine for individuals potentially exposed to COVID-19 who have no symptoms. If your child is exposed to COVID19, carefully monitor your child for symptoms for 10 days following exposure.

JJ will not quarantine an entire class should a child or faculty member in that class test positive.

COVID Notification

Families will be notified if a student/staff member in your child's class tests positive for COVID19 and given the last date attending JJ. Families always have the option to keep their child at home from school exposure and/or send their child to school with a mask.

Sick Policy

Below is a list of symptoms for COVID19. If your child has a fever above 100 degrees Fahrenheit OR more than one of the below symptoms, please keep your child home until 24 hrs after the resolution of symptoms, or a negative COVID test, or an alternative diagnosis is given.

- Congestion or runny nose (not caused by seasonal allergies)
- Cough (for children with chronic cough due to allergies or asthma, a change in their cough from baseline)
- Sore throat (not caused by seasonal allergies)
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing (for children with asthma, a change from baseline)
- Muscle/body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea (that cannot be contained in a diaper)
